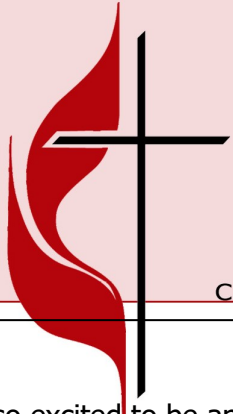

Operation Christmas Child

The Mission and Outreach Committee is coordinating Operation Christmas Child this year. They are asking for individuals and groups to begin shopping so they can pack their own shoeboxes.

All the back to school items are on sale. Each box should have 2 pencils, pen, 70 page tablet, eraser, ruler and pencil sharpener. Zip lock quart bag makes a great pencil kit holder. Include a solar calculator and the children will be ready for the missionaries to start teaching them. For the little ones a box of crayons and a coloring book are great.

They will need hygiene items but no toothpaste: washcloth, large bar of mild soap (double bagged), tooth brush, comb and nail clippers are appreciated.

Clothing: flip flops are on sale, or T-shirts, undershirts, socks, underwear, caps, hats, gloves, or scarves.

Some small toys ideas would be balls, dice, marbles, yo-yos, books, puzzles, Barbie's, jump rope, dolls, cards, Legos, whistles, small stuffed animals, kazoo's, cars, craft kits, jewelry kits, harmonicas, slinky, small hammers, screw drivers, or work gloves. If you sew, then tops, purses, caps etc. No candy, liquids or lotions.

Shoeboxes are on order and will be provided in October. You should mark your box with boy or girl and the appropriate age group 2-4, 5-9. or 10-14. Include \$9.00 for shipping Payable to Samaritan's Purse, if you are packing more than one shoe box, you can combine in a single envelope.

United Methodist Men

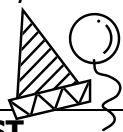

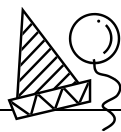
